


FALL 2022 **DATA**

- Established in 1971, LaGuardia has the largest English as a Second Language (ESL) program in New York City.
- LaGuardia ranked #5 among U.S. two-year colleges in economic mobility - moving low-income people to the middle class and beyond - in a Stanford University study.
- LaGuardia students are more likely to transfer to a 4-year college than community college students nationally.
- Over the past decade, the LaGuardia Community College Foundation has raised more than \$51 million for scholarships, emergency funds and new initiatives aimed at enhancing student success.
- LaGuardia is a national voice on behalf of community colleges, and has garnered major support from such leading funders as Goldman Sachs Gives, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the Robin Hood Foundation, Henry Luce Foundation, The Carroll and Milton Petrie Foundation, and The Teagle Foundation.


WHERE DO OUR STUDENTS COME FROM?

Over **22,000 students from 130 countries** come to LaGuardia Community College each year.






ENROLLMENT





RACE/ETHNICITY
