IV. President's Report:

Senator Sokolski informed the Senate that she attended the CUNY Faculty Senate meeting. Schools are being asked to provide details of their budget, not only tax levy, but also foundation and other moneys.

This is a move to allow for more clarity and transparency in the allocation of funds.

Senate needs to have a stronger budget committee; more people can join the budget committee, including students.

The University Faculty Senate, UFS, report puts us in a place where we can make inquiries, but so far the budget advisory committee is a separate

committee, not a Senate Committee. The Senate needs to make sure the budget committee works.

The committee of elections also needs members from the general college population.

The Committee on Committees needs Senators to join. This Committee is made up of Senators only, so Senator Sokolski asked all Senators to help out and join.

(UFS): Senator Theresa Licari added that CFO, Mathew Sapienza informed: 75 million over four years savings

4 year salience plan to make the administrative sector leaner (CUNY central) Funding from outside sources is being contemplated.

Selling air rights: CUNY has many buildings in NY.

Exploring possibilities of increasing tuition in certain programs that are more expensive.

Finally, Senator Sokolski mentioned that the different committees of the Senate, student, HEOS and Faculty, should identify their priorities. Patricia recommends that it's important for HEOS to bring VPs to their meetings. Wish lists for each constituency must be brought forward.
