




Age Fall 2018 to Fall 2022

There is a wide range of ages in the credit-student population. Over half of students were traditional college age in 2022 (age 17 to 22) while ten percent were younger than 17. Additionally, Twenty-eight percent of the students were older than 25 with seventeen percent over 30. The median age is 20, and is a year less than in Fall 2020 and Fall 2021.

Similar to their peers nationally, the majority of credit students at LaGuardia are women. In Fall 2022 the proportion of women in the student body was fifty-seven percent, lower than the high point in Fall 2005 when it was sixty-two percent. Nationally, Fifty-eight percent of the students enrolled in 2-year public colleges were female in 2021 (the most recent data available).





Race and Ethnic Background

One of the core values of LaGuardia Community College is diversity. The metric often used for diversity is the proportion of under-represented minorities (URM). URM are comprised of Hispanic, Black (Non-Hispanic) and Native American. While non-resident international students are not separated in the previous LaGuardia based charts, mandated federal reports to the National Center of Educational Statistics (NCES) exclude the race/ethnic information of non-resident students. Consequently, when NCES data are used for national comparisons, the race/ethnic information for LaGuardia is slightly different than reported in the previous charts. Accordingly, LaGuardia's URM in Fall 2021 was 62 percent of the student body while the URM for all 2-year public institutions in Fall 2020 according to NCES was 39 percent of the total student population. Additionally, 5 percent of LaGuardia students are international compare to 1 percent nationally.

Financial Resources 2022-2023

Seventy-three percent of annual degree students (9,058 out of 12,395) were awarded some form of grant, scholarship or financial aid in 2022-23. Forty-two percent of students who filled FAFSA lived independently of their parents. Eighty-two percent all full-time students (6,991 out of 8,535) were awarded financial aid. Financial need is ascertained by subtracting a federally determined proportion of a student family's financial resources from the total cost of attendance. Six percent of students receiving aid took out Direct Loans. Forty-two percent of the financially dependent student families, and fifty-four percent of the financially independent students who were awarded aid earned less than \$25,000.





Compared to Fall 2021, Fall 2022 total credit enrollment dropped by 1,039 students from 14,913 to 13,064 (-8.8% change). Additionally, the number of new credit students (freshmen, transfer, and non-degree) increased by 29 new students (0.8% change).

Credit Students by Degree Type Fall 2018 to Fall 2022

Over the past five years the proportion of Associate of Science (A.S.) of the degree seeking students decreased from a 47 percent high in Fall 2018 to 43 percent in the past two years. The proportion of Associate of Arts (A.A) students decreased from 25 percent to 22 percent in the past three years. The proportion of students enrolled in occupational degree programs for the Associate in Applied Sciences (A.A.S.) degree has been increasing from 27 percent in Fall 2018 to 32 percent in the past two years.



Credit Students by Full-Time and Part-Time Status Fall 2013 to Fall 2022



Part-time students took an average of 7.1 equated credits (college-level and remedial credits) in Fall 2022 compared to 7.0 in Fall 2021, while full-time students took an average of 15.5 equated credits, similar to the average 15.5 equated credit load of full-time students in Fall 2021.


In 2021-22 (Fall 2021 - Spring 22) 11.1 percent of the First-time Full-time students earned 30 or more credits.

Attendance Pattern for Session 1 Only



Students with mixed schedules, that is, some day courses, some evening courses, and perhaps even a weekend course, were put in the "Mixed" schedule category.

Fall Enrollment by Session Fall 2018 to Fall 2022





LaGuardia offers classes on a two-semester basis, fall and spring, with each semester divided into two sessions, I and II. The four annual sessions run consecutively and do not overlap. Each Session I lasts twelve weeks, while each Session II lasts six weeks. Many students take a full semester load spread over Session I and Session II. The semester/session calendar allows students more flexibility in scheduling with four possible start dates. The possibility of spreading a semester's load over 18 weeks also allows students to schedule class and work time more efficiently. For Fall 2022, fifty two percent of session I students also enrolled in Session II, a 4 percentage points increase compare to Fall 2021, and close to the high of fifty-three percent in Fall 2018.

Class Size by Session Fall 2018 to Fall 2022






The average class in Session I of Fall 2022 was 19.5 students, while the average class in Session II was 18.3 students. Fall 2022 class size is lower than in Fall 2021 for Session I (21.1 students) and for Session II (19.7 students).

New Students Admission and Enrollment

Degree-Seeking Students Fall 2018 to Fall 2022

Applicants who are admitted to LaGuardia pass through the CUNY admissions system. Applicants list their preferences for particular CUNY schools. CUNY allocates applicants to each college in multiple phases. Beginning in 2012 any student who indicated LaGuardia as one of six CUNY choices was counted as admitted. The proportion of admitted freshmen who enrolled at LaGuardia decreased to 12 percent compared to 14 percent in the previous three years. The proportion of admitted transfers who enrolled increased from its low point of 37 percent in Fall 2021 to 39 percent in Fall 2022, but it is still considerably lower than 2018 to 2020.




by First-Time, Transfer, and Non-Degree Status Fall 2018 to Fall 2022















Degrees Awarded by Race and Ethnic Origin



Comparative Racial and Ethnic Distribution




Degrees Awarded by Entering Basic Skills Status Five-Year Trend




GPAs of Graduates



About a quarter of graduates in 2017-18 to 2019-20 earned an average GPA of 3.5 or higher while about a third earned a GPA of 3-3.45 and about 40 percent earned average GPA of less than 3. However, the average GPA for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 graduates improved considerably with about 10 percent more earning grades over 3.5 and 10 percent fewer earning a GPA that is less than 3.0. This is probably because of the CR/NC grading policy during the pandemic.

Baccalaureate Transfer Rate of Freshmen


Percentage of Fall 2016 Freshmen Who Transferred to 4-year Institutions, Within Six Years

Five-Year Trend of One-Year Transfer Rates






Post-Graduation Primary Activity

Employed Full or Part Time






Salary Distribution of All 2021-22 Graduates Within Six Month from Graduation












ACE Enrollment by Borough FY 2021-22



Fall 2022 Employees by Business Entities









Full Time Tax Levy Employees by Job Category and Age Range, Fall 2022







Workforce Percentages by Years of Employment at LaGuardia, Fall 2022





Tenure Track Faculty by Tenure Status* Fall 2022







Print and Electronic Collections




Expenditures (in thousands of dollars)




Circulation Transactions of General & Reserve Collections (in thousands)*








Grant Awards by Source FY 2017-18 to FY 2021-22

Total Grant Awards FY 2017-18 to FY 2021-22








